The information that the Pandemic hides have not changed. According to data from the Executive Secretariat of the National Public Security System prior to the Pandemic, in Mexico there are 10 women murdered a day. On May 8, the National Human Rights Commission (CNDH) warned in a statement that domestic violence has increased during the quarantine by Covid19. Unlike what the president declared in his morning "homilies", home is not a safe space for women. Although the northern state of Mexico, Coahuila, is not the state in the country in which most women are being killed, just last year femicides increased 600%. According to the National Survey of Victimization and Perception on Public Safety for 2019, of the 16 million crimes that were made public, there is 95% impunity, including crimes of femicide violence. With these data the doubt is reiterated. Guilty people is been manufactured at the Coahuila prosecutor's office or justice is selective when the pressure for the government image is evident.
